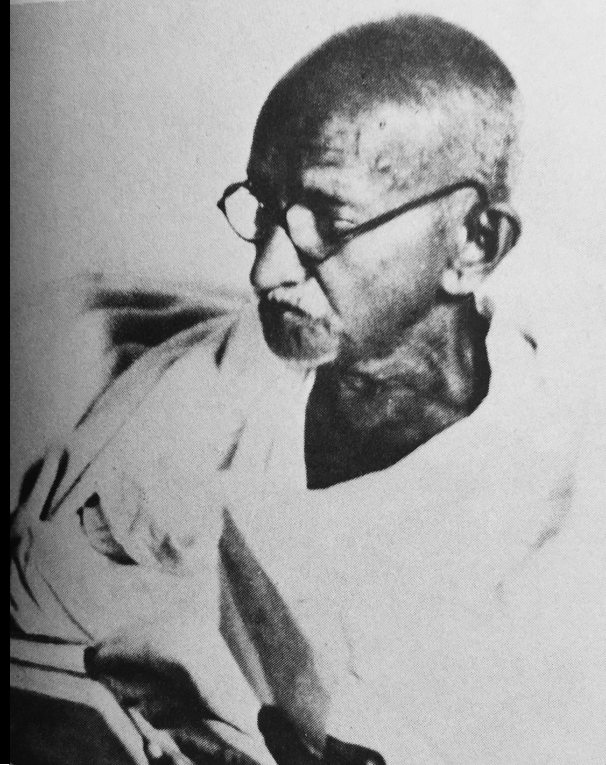


Educational Programs at the Gandhi Memorial Center

Each year the Gandhi Center receives a group of visitors that includes high school juniors from across the United States who participate in the YES Abroad program in India. Their visit to the Gandhi Center is part of their preparation for their year of living and studying in India. The US Department of State's Kennedy-Lugar Youth Exchange and Study Abroad program provides competitive merit-based scholarships for US citizens in secondary school to study for one academic year in select countries.



A course is offered at the Gandhi Center each year for members of Osher Lifelong Learning Institute entitled: "India: Culture, Traditions and Gandhi." The course varies from year to year but many subjects are repeated and new guest artists and scholars join to offer lecture/demonstrations.



Throughout the year the Gandhi Center provides educational field trip visits for DC Public and Public Charter Schools through the DC Collaborative "Arts and Humanities for Every Student" program. These interactive programs are designed to introduce students to Gandhi and the cultural heritage of India.
